Welcome to Price City - home of ethnical diversity for many years. Price is located in the southeastern section of Carbon County, Utah. Price is the largest seat within the County's municipalities and the hub of Carbon and Emery Counties.

Price is home to approximately 8,715 residents; but, serves as the religious, business, shopping, and entertainment center for over 32,000 neighboring residents.

The Price Police Department employs 17 sworn officers. Two officers and an additional sergeant are assigned as investigators for the department and one officer is assigned as a school resource officer. The most crucial members are the remaining eight patrol officers and two sergeants who alternate schedules providing 24-hour patrol coverage.

Our department is dedicated to serving our citizens and visitors in the most professional manner possible. The department members are also part of the community and strive to make Price City a safe community where citizens feel secure in living and raising their families.
